CAMPBELL COMMISSION	Supervisor Campbell gave an update on the Campbell Commission, noting the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The next Campbell Commission will be next Thursday, April 1st. • Two members were added to the Campbell Commission that were involved in the Police Reform. • They will be focusing on a review of the Police Reform and what kind of action they should be taking over the next couple of months in support of continuous review of that document and they will be bringing back through Committees any updates.

a. Resolution: <i>Authorizing Letter of Consent Concerning T-Mobile Wireless Communications Equipment Deployed at the Victor Tower Site</i>	Betsy Landre presented a resolution to authorize a letter of consent to authorize T-Mobile to authorize their update to equipment at the Victor Tower Site. Supervisor Todd Campbell motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Daryl Marshall. The motion carried.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT	
a. Resolution: <i>Acceptance of FY2020 Hazardous Material Emergency Preparedness (HMEP) Grant – Office of Emergency Management</i>	<p>Jeff Harloff presented a resolution to apply for a grant that has been annual for the last 26 years. Training will be part of the use of this grant and there is a cost match. This year’s grant program is a little tighter than usual.</p> <p>Supervisor Daryl Marshall motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Cathy Menikotz. The motion carried.</p>
b. Discussion: <i>Notification that State Fire will be changing Student Handbooks for Outreach Training Courses</i>	<p>Jeff Harloff informed the Committee that State Fire will be changing the books that are used for their outreach training program. The County maintains a supply of 42 books; they are used for three of the training classes that State Fire teaches, they have enough books that two classes could be going on. The 7th edition is around \$90 which is approximately \$4,000 plus shipping and handling.</p> <p>Mr. Harloff also informed the Committee they had a consultation for hazmat recently where they deployed some supplies after a motor vehicle accident. They are seeking reimbursement through the operator of the motor vehicle to reimburse the County the costs associated with the replacement of materials that will total approximately \$300.</p>
OFFICE OF SHERIFF	
a. Resolution: <i>Authorizing Purchase of E-911 Equipment Upgrade to TCI Technology and Equipment, LLC an affiliate of Frontier Communications</i>	<p>Sheriff Henderson presented an addendum resolution for approval to install digital switches at the 911 Center to take them away from analog at a cost of \$24,784.43 from TCI Technology.</p> <p>Supervisor Todd Campbell motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Daryl Marshall. The motion carried.</p>
b. Update: <i>Jail Population</i>	<p>Sheriff Henderson reviewed the jail population:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Current – 95 • Females – 12 • Weekend High – 97 • Sentenced – 18 • Parole detainees without additional criminal charges - 8.
PUBLIC HEALTH	
	<p>Public Health Director, Mary Beer gave a COVID19 update noting the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 6,170 Ontario County residents that have been tested positive. • 104 deaths to date. • 33,541 residents have had their first vaccine dose: being number 1 in the region in terms of percentage of the population. • Plans are to have a POD (point of dispensing) at Hobart & William Smith College and FLCC as well, when the eligibility changes. • Supervisor Campbell questioned with the vaccine good for 90

	<p>days, who would be managing all the visitors coming to the County over the summer. Ms. Beer replied she is not sure they have the answer from the state on that. They are still doing studies how long the vaccine will last, and whether a booster will be needed.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They have been asking the state to embrace the CDC's guidelines so the kids can get back to school.
COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR	
<i>Updates</i>	<p>Chris DeBolt gave the following updates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They are starting to hear on the control room and releases is the state is really going to incentivize an Excelsior Passport, an app for the phone. • They are saying unofficially, they expect the vaccine to last more than the 90 days, they just don't have the data to prove it. • No cases or quarantines for County employees. • Leaders group next Wednesday, they will continue discussions about the departments plans to increase in person operations. • Schools are getting a lot of pressure from parents to open five days. • Federal stimulus money: The County is slated to get approximately \$21.5 MM. They are waiting for guidance from the Department of Treasury.
<i>PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR</i>	<p>Chairman Marren reported the state is going through the budget process, as of Monday, there had been no face to face meetings with the Assembly, Senate, and the Governor. He noted one item that was split between the House and Assembly and both were not in favor of is shared jails. The other two items for the radar are the potential legalization of marijuana and the need to put out a RFP for County wide for potential EMS and Fire study.</p>
