<b>CALL TO ORDER</b>	The meeting of the Public Safety Committee was called to order at 11:01 am by Chairman Robert Green.
<b>MINUTES</b>	Supervisor Todd Campbell made a motion to approve the minutes of the Public Safety Committee meeting from March 24, 2021. Supervisor Greg Bendzłowicz seconded the motion. The motion carried.
<b>PUBLIC HEALTH Update</b>	Public Health Director, Mary Beer gave a COVID19 update noting the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● 6,721 cases since the onset</li><li>● No new deaths this week</li><li>● 15% of student related cases, but not acquired in school</li><li>● 53.4% of adults over the age of 18 residents have their first dose with 32.5 % have their second dose.</li><li>● Johnson &amp; Johnson vaccine has been put on hold due to 6 individuals out of 6.8 million vaccinations that have had serious complications of blood clots.</li><li>● Concerned that some have not come for their second doses.</li><li>● Studies are still being done for efficacy noting they are saying 6 months.</li></ul>

The motion carried.</p> <p>Sheriff Henderson explained that the informational item is in regard to the cameras at Eastview Mall. Their current vendor is no longer supporting these cameras. He is seeking permission to use current federal asset forfeiture money in the amount of \$44,495 to replace the obsolete cameras with new cameras. The purchase of the cameras is through state contract.</p> <p>Supervisor Bendzlowicz asked if the cost included only one year of</p>

It was clarified that the contract agreement cost includes five years of maintenance and service.</p> <p>Supervisor Greg Bendzlowicz motioned to approve the budget transfer to cover the purchase, installation and the first FIVE years of service for the cameras at Eastview Mall. Supervisor Todd Campbell seconded the motion. The motion carried.</p> <p>Sheriff Henderson presented a photo of a response vehicle with the changed graphics and explained it keeps them aligned with their accreditation. He explained he has had conversation with Mr. Harloff. He reiterated that the graphic shows it is also EMS and Fire as well.</p> <p>Sheriff Henderson reviewed the jail population:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Current – 96</li> <li>• Females – 16</li> <li>• Weekend High – 98</li> <li>• Sentenced – 17</li> <li>• Parole violations – 8</li> </ul> <p>Sheriff Henderson noted they have 23 inmates that are state ready and are waiting for the Department of Corrections to take possession of these incarcerated individuals. Sheriff Henderson noted they were notified that Bedford, which is the female state correctional institution, is shut down due to COVID.</p> <p>Supervisor Bendzlowicz asked about a resolution that is in place stating an inmate should be transported to a state facility within 10 days of being state ready. Sheriff Henderson concurred and noted that they are meeting all the guidelines, but the state is still not taking these inmates.</p> <p>Sheriff Henderson noted the issue with DBL and its correlation with overtime.</p> <p>Sheriff Henderson reviewed Road Patrol and at least five either on disability, military leave, workman’s comp and quarantine.</p>

<p><i>Informational: Proposal to have RGRTA (the RTS-Ontario Bus System) move communications to the County’s 700 MHz Radio System</i></p>	<p>Tom Harvey gave a presentation on the Rochester Genesee Regional Transportation Authority (RGRTA) and the use of County Radio Communications System. He explained the existing radio network. He reviewed the Phase 1 and Phase 2 radio system design capabilities, RGRTA’s request and the agreement terms.</p>

	<p>Todd Campbell gave the following updates with the Campbell Commission:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• They held their meeting on April 1<sup>st</sup> with lengthy discussions.</li> <li>• Dr. Sim Covington, Chief Diversity Officer of FLCC and Amy Babiarez representing the LBGQT communities are their newest members to the Campbell Commission.</li> <li>• They discussed the marijuana legislation that had just been enacted. There was discussion on the County taking a lead on creating a white paper for the municipalities to have some understanding of what different towns, cities and villages would have to do to move forward.</li> <li>• They discussed an idea of creating a care/case manager for the Police Reform Initiative and for the last year or more of the Campbell Commission.</li> <li>• They discussed Mental Health issues and their increased numbers in the jail; trying to find a way to have an individual to help work with a resident or someone who's having a mental health crisis work their way through the process.</li> <li>• Their next meeting will be in May.</li> </ul>
<b>COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR</b>	
<i>Updates</i>	<p>Chris DeBolt gave the following updates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Operational updates, they have six positive cases of employees.</li> <li>• They are looking at bringing more staff to work in the beginning of May.</li> <li>• Discussion of the state guidance meeting the CDC guidelines with school and the distance going from 6 feet to 3 feet, noting there is 24 pages that has come out for guidance and where we land in the percentage of transmission. They continue to meet with the Superintendents Monday mornings.</li> <li>• The adoption of the state budget. There was restoration of a lot of money in the state budget. His concern is the intercept of local sales tax revenues and the precedent it creates. He briefly highlighted what the state budget did and did not provide for.</li> </ul>
