CALL TO ORDER	The meeting of the Public Safety Committee was called to order at 11:00 am by Chairman Bob Green.
MINUTES	Supervisor Todd Campbell made a motion to approve the minutes of the Public Safety Committee meeting from April 13, 2022. Supervisor Daryl Marshall seconded the motion. The motion carried.
EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT	
	Jeff Harloff presented a brief video created to recruit for Ontario County Emergency Services volunteers.
Board of Supervisors	
<i>Informational: Expansion of Video Conferencing</i>	Kristin Mueller presented information regarding the proposed local law for amendment of the open meetings law for the requirements for videoconferencing She noted the Town of Canandaigua has put in their local law to cover the Boards under them. She asked if that is something the County should do. It was the consensus to include the boards under the umbrella of the county's proposed local law. discussion took place on what would qualify as extraordinary circumstances and who is included in the criteria for video conferencing. The proposed local law is from July 1, 2022, to July of 2024.
CAMPBELL COMMISSION	
	Supervisor Todd Campbell said the next meeting will be tomorrow morning. They will continue the Community navigator liaison discussion. He pointed out that there are about 196 active trust accounts between the Conflict Defender and the Public Defender. He reported the weekend Alternative to Incarceration (ATI) program; the numbers of about 75% coming through drug court.

Resolution: Reappointments to the Ontario County Fire Advisory Board through June 2024 – Clark, DeRuttyer, Magnera, McConnell	Jeff Harloff presented two resolutions of reappointments to the Ontario County Fire Advisory Board, the one resolution with a term ending June 30, 2024, and the other with a term ending June 30, 2025. Supervisor Mark Venuti motioned to approve the two resolutions as a block, seconded by Supervisor Lou Guard. The motion carried.

OFFICE OF SHERIFF	
Informational: Selection of Company to Install Emergency, Safety and Operational Equipment in County Vehicles	Bill Wright presented information regarding the selection of a company to install the emergency, safety, and operational equipment. They did an RFP and had 3 proposals and recommended Gerber Collision and Glass.
Informational: Vehicle Replacement Plans 2023-2024	Mr. Wright presented information on the replacement of the vehicles under the Sheriff's department.
Resolution: Authorization to Order Revised 2023 Sheriff Fleet	Mr. Wright presented a resolution to revise the order for the 2023 Sheriff's fleet to coincide with the CIP budget. Supervisor Todd Campbell motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Daryl Marshall. The motion carried.
Resolution: Setting Conversion Fee for Recalculation of Judgement Executions Performed by the Ontario County Sheriff's Civil Office	Sheriff Povero presented a resolution to set the conversion fee of \$35 per judgment for the recalculation of judgement executions performed by the Sheriff's Civil Office. Supervisor Todd Campbell motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Daryl Marshall. The motion carried.
Jail Updates	Sheriff Povero reviewed the jail population: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Current – 86 • Females – 14 • Weekend high – 83 The state does a comparison on statistics and the average daily census for March of 2021 for the county was 96 and as of March 2022, the average daily populations declined to 87 which is a 9.4% decrease.

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR	
Resolution: Reappointment of Carrie W. Bleakley – Conflict Defender	Chris DeBolt presented a resolution to reappoint Carrie Bleakley as the Conflict Defender. Supervisor Todd Campbell motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Lou Guard. The motion carried.
Updates	Mr. DeBolt reported the Covid cases and hospitalizations are up, and they have test kits available. Mr. DeBolt reported there is a provision on the state budget to allow counties to suspend or cap the gas tax (sales tax). There will be a discussion in more detail with numbers at the Governmental Operations and Insurance Committee and the Ways and Means Committee this afternoon. Mr. DeBolt noted Mr. Jacob Welch has a thought out and elaborate proposal for both the county and federal government to assist the refugees from the Ukrainian war in Eastern Europe. Mr. DeBolt said it is beyond the scope of anything the county can do. He is bringing it to their attention to let the supervisors know he is having conversation with him to assist with giving suggestions to find an alternative solution.
PRIVILEGE of the FLOOR	
	Sheriff Povero said the Law Day Ceremony is on May 18 th . One of the highlights of the ceremony is the recognition of the fallen in the line of duty. This year they will be recognizing Deputy Sheriff Malcomb Strong. He was a resident of Victor and a former Victor Town Supervisor and perished in an automobile accident in 1983. He said they recently brought on a new German Shepherd in the K9 division and following with tradition on naming the canine, the canine has been named Canine Malcomb. Sheriff Povero reported on May 11 th , the Victor-Farmington Rotary Club will be recognizing the East View Mall deputies for their service at the Ravenwood Country Club. Sheriff Povero reported for the first four months of this year, the investigators have processed 137 pistol permit applications. He said it was a relatively high amount for 2022. Sheriff Povero stated the National DEA medication take back was successful; noting it was held at Wegmans last Saturday.
