| Resolution: Amend Contract with Amy Ladow TVI O&M – CWSNP (Preschool) 2022-2023 | Chris DeBolt, on behalf of Mary Beer, presented two resolutions to amend the contracts with Amy Ladow TVI O&M and TVI Lehman Services for a change in rates for TVI services. |

| Resolution: Authorization for Professional Consultant Contract Unity of Cayuga County, Inc., Unity Employment Services – Mental Health – 2022 | Sandy Seeber presented a resolution to contract with Unity of Cayuga County. Supervisor Tammie Hicks motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Daryl, Marshall. The motion carried. |

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| <p>Resolution: <i>Amendment of Professional Consultant Contract Council on Alcoholism and Addictions of the Finger Lakes – Mental Health – 2022</i></p> <p>Resolution: <i>Amendment of Professional Service Contract with Partnership for Ontario County – Mental Health – 2022</i></p> | <p>Ms. Seeber presented two resolutions to amend the contract with Council on Alcoholism and Addictions of the Finger Lakes and Partnership for Ontario County for NYS OASAS funding and the approval of the budget transfers.</p> <p>Supervisor Fred Wille motioned to approve the two resolutions as a block, seconded by Supervisor Jared Simpson. The motion carried.</p> <p>Ms. Seeber noted that Dr. Mitchell will be requesting funds next round, explaining individuals that are incompetent to stand trial and are in the hospital and may be long term. She said they have budgeted \$650,000 for the year 2022 and are already at \$630,000 with the April billing.</p> |
| <p>PUBLIC HEALTH</p> | |
| <p><i>Updates</i></p> | <p>Mary Beer gave the following updates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The wastewater testing in Canandaigua is showing a trending up in COVID. They are averaging 20 cases a day. • NYC is seeing a significant trend increase and are recommending masking again. It is with variant 4 and 5. • They are having trouble hiring public health nurses with a bachelor’s degree. • They are requesting to add a health educator. |
| <p>OFFICE FOR THE AGING</p> | |
| <p><i>Update</i></p> | <p>Irene Coveny gave an update on the collaborative in the Finger Lakes for mobility management. They had a grant a couple of years ago call the 5310 grant where they placed a half time mobility manager who is place in the New York Connects program so anybody, any age, can call and they will help connect them with transportation services. The other part of the grant was to do a one-click system where it is a web-based system. They teamed up with Livingston and Monroe County to apply for another grant and they just received noticed they received the grant. Genesee and Wayne Counties have expressed interest to come in on this. The grant requires some match noting \$10,000 per year for two years or maybe in-kind. Supervisor Wille asked if they have considered marketing with Causewave for this collaborative.</p> |
| <p>YOUTH BUREAU</p> | |
| <p><i>Updates</i></p> | <p>Marsha Foote gave an update that she has met with her board, and they have determined eleven agencies for allocation amounts in the county and will be submitting a resolution. She said they were only able to allocate out \$88,000 to these agencies. She also said the Partnership for Ontario County, under the umbrella, use a club house called Epic in Geneva. She now has another Epic clubhouse in Bloomfield.</p> |

| | <p>Eileen Tiberio discussed her hiring challenges in her department. She also reported on the challenge of detention noting the three levels of detention and the facilities: detention, secure detention, and specialized secure detention. She explained in depth the issue of finding the</p> |

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| | <p>different type of detention facilities, the complexities, and costs.</p> <p>Ms. Tiberio discussed the situations with foster care and the kids that have some type of mental health diagnosis and no place to put the kids due to the safety of the home and the hospitals not being able to keep them.</p> <p>Ms. Tiberio reported homelessness continues, averaging 122 a night in the shelters.</p> <p>Ms. Tiberio reported the rental subsidy plan has been approved by the state.</p> <p>Additional discussion took place regarding the detention facility and homeless shelters.</p> |
| WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT | |
| <i>Updates</i> | <p>Andrea McGraw reported that they did get the numbers for the WIB. For the adult dislocated worker program, they will receive \$143,044 and for the youth program they will receive \$94,635.</p> <p>Ms. McGraw gave an update on the summer youth program and have had 50 youth placed in almost 25 worksites.</p> |

| | <p>Chris DeBolt gave the following updates on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The energy efficiency study • The RFP for housing study is out and responses are due back today or tomorrow. • He met with the school Superintendents along with Mary Gates, Jessica Mitchell, and Chairman Jack Marren, and Vice Chair Campbell. the Superintendents indicated a real need for mental health services. They will try to reach out to higher education to maybe incorporate interns. • There will be workshop symposium on August 5th and October 7th where, rather than make Ms. Mitchell and her staff go to all the schools, they will set it up where Mental Health, Public Health, Partnerships, and all other stakeholders in one spot. • They had a statewide leaders call last week regarding monkey pox. The numbers are not good downstate. |
